Dear Speaker Boehner, Leader Pelosi, Majority Leader McCarthy, and Minority Whip Hoyer:

We write to raise concerns regarding legislative proposals that would reduce dividend payments on required Federal Reserve stock until there is greater examination of the issue and an understanding of the implications that such a statutory change might have on the banking system.

Existing law requires that all Fed member banks must purchase stock issued by their Federal Reserve Bank as a condition of their membership in the Federal Reserve System. In return, they receive a six percent dividend on the stock. It is important to note this stock does not carry with it the typical features of common stock. For example, member banks cannot sell Federal Reserve Bank stock or pledge it as collateral. After paying its operating expenses and dividends owed to member banks, each Federal Reserve Bank funds a capital surplus account. Any remaining earnings are transferred to the Department of the Treasury.

We believe that any potential modifications to the current stockownership structure of the Federal Reserve Banks should be thoroughly studied and analyzed to help ensure that Congress understands the policy implications of any changes. In fact, when testifying before the Senate Banking Committee in July, Federal Reserve Chair Yellen stated that the change "could conceivably have unintended consequences" and that "it deserves some serious thought and analysis." Consistent with that, the Chairman of the Financial Services Committee has written to the Government Accountability Office (GAO) to request a study of the policy, the historic rationale for requiring member banks to hold Federal Reserve Bank stock, the federal budgetary implications of reducing the six percent dividend rate, and broader questions such as whether member bank ownership of Federal Reserve Bank stock should be voluntary rather than mandatory and whether the stock itself should be permanently retired.

Until GAO completes its work and the congressional committees of jurisdiction have an opportunity to review the significant public policy questions at issue, we believe that changes to the Federal Reserve dividend rate are premature.






